CSBS CHOREOGRAPHY COMPETITION RULES

ENTRY

- 1. Entry forms must be completed and handed in one week before the competition. Late entries may not be accepted.
- 2. The competition is only open to students from Central Scotland Ballet School.
- 3. Competitors can only make a single Solo entry in each category.
- 4. An individual can enter in any number of different groups or duets in each category.
- 5. Age groups may be altered according to the number of entries in each category.
- 6. Duets and groups will be in an age-group based on their average age.

TIME LIMITS / MUSIC

- 1. Dances in all 6-11 age groups must not exceed 1 minute 30 seconds.
- 2. Dances in 12+ age groups must not exceed 1 minute 40 seconds.
- 3. The music may be stopped should it exceed the time limit, or points deducted.
- 4. Music must be cut to the correct length and sent in advance of the competition day.
- 5. Music must not contain explicit or suggestive lyrics. Parents <u>must</u> check their child's music before the competition. Music may be stopped if it is considered inappropriate.

COSTUME AND GROOMING

- 1. Competitors should be properly attired and groomed for dancing with appropriate footwear and hairstyle. Elaborate costumes are not required.
- 2. Costumes should be age appropriate and cover underwear.
- 3. Props are allowed but must be safely cleared from the floor after your performance.

BALLET / POINTE CATEGORIES

- 1. Ballet routines can be in a classical or modern ballet / free movement style.
- 2. No acro style tricks are permitted in a ballet routine.
- 3. It is not permitted to perform classical repertoire; choreography must be your own.
- 4. In the interest of safety, only students currently studying pointe work with CSBS are eligible to enter the pointe category.

ACROBATIC DANCE CATEGORY

- 1. In the interest of safety, competitors should not attempt tricks which they have not been trained to perform.
- 2. A CSBS specialist Acrobatics teacher will join the judging panel for the acro section to better assess technique. Note: acrobatic technique differs from gymnastics.

CHARACTER CATEGORY

- 1. A character dance should reflect a dance style from a particular country.
- 2. Props are allowed but must be safely cleared from the floor after your performance.

MUSICAL THEATRE CATEGORY (Song and Dance)

- 1. Routines must include both live singing and dance elements.
- 2. Routines missing a dance element will have points deducted.
- 3. Backing tracks must not include lead vocals.
- 4. The category may be performed without microphone amplification.

JAZZ DANCE CATEGORY

- 1. Jazz includes traditional jazz; jive; charleston; MT style; and lyrical.
- 2. Tricks are permitted but must be performed safely as a small part of the routine.

LITTLE STARS SECTION

- 1. Open to all ages and abilities including but not exclusively age 6 and under or adults.
- 2. Any style of dance is permitted.
- 3. Music must not exceed 1 minute.
- 4. Competitors can perform solo / duets / groups.

IMPROVISATION SECTION

- 1. Open to all ages and abilities; competitors will dance together in a mixed group
- 2. A range of music styles will be used.
- 3. This part of the competition is an elimination based on the judges choices.
- 4. Appropriate dance shoes and clothes should be worn onstage.

PHOTOGRAPHY / RECORDING

- 1. Parents are allowed to photograph or video their own children but must not stand on the dance floor or distract the dancers or judges (No flash photography).
- 2. CSBS will film the entire event for archives.
- 3. CSBS will photograph competitors. Photos may be used on social media / for publicity.

JUDGING / PRESENTATION OF PRIZES

- 1. Routines are judged on Technique / Content / Performance.
- 2. Certificates will be presented to every competitor at the end of each dance section.
- 3. All competitors are expected to stay to the end of the competition for the prize giving and to congratulate other competitors.
- 4. The independent adjudicators' decision is final. Additional or joint medals may be presented in sections at the discretion of the judging panel.
- 5. Judges will award additional trophies for the highest scores in each category.
 - a. "Highest points for ballet" includes ballet/character/pointe
 - b. "Highest points in jazz" includes jazz/lyrical/commercial
- 6. Judges will award the "Millennium Trophy" for 'best overall'.
- 7. Judges will award the "Spirit of the Dance" trophy to the competitor who demonstrates the most musicality, enjoyment and performance.
- 8. The "Best Newcomer" trophy will be awarded to a dancer who has not previously participated in a CSBS choreography competition.
- 9. The winner of the improvisation section will be presented with the "Falkirk Arts Network Award for improvisation".

OTHER

- 1. The Millennium Trophy winner will perform a solo in <u>at least one</u> of the CSBS annual dance displays.
- 2. At the discretion of CSBS staff, other dances may be selected for displays or community performances throughout the year.
- 3. All competitors and audience members must show courtesy, encouragement, support and respect to all the other competitors and their friends/family.
